

Quality

european students' union

- Quality depends on expectations
 - What is a "good" toaster?
 - What is a "good" study programme?
- Fairly easy ...
- Difficult ...

- A stakeholder-relative concept
 - Stakeholders have specific expectations
 - Hardly possible to define quality absolutely
- Quality assurance must ...
 - ... involve all stakeholders,
 - ... allow expression of expectations and
 - facilitate negotiation of different expectations



Who are the key stakeholders?




- Internally: Within the HEI
 - HEI leadership
 - Professors and teaching staff
 - Non-academic staff
 - Students
- Externally: The social partners
 - Employers and employers' organisations
 - Employees and trade unions

European Standards & Guidelines (ESG)

European level European Quality Assurance Register (EQR)

National level

- Legal framework
- External quality assurance

The institution

- Quality development and improvement
- Partnership culture (staff & students)



QA at European level



- Principles:
 - National and institutional diversity
 - European frameworks, rather than detailed regulation
- European Standards & Guidelines for QA
 - Developed by the "E4 Group" (Institutions, Students, Quality Assurance Agencies) jointly
 - About internal & external QA
 - To facilitate development of national QA systems
 - To ensure comparability and compatibility of QA
 - To create mutual trust in QA systems



QA at European level (cont.)



- European Quality Assurance Register (EQR)
 - Developed by EUA, EURASHE, ENQA, ESU (E4)
 - Endorsed by Ministers in London, May 2007
- The purposes
 - To list agencies complying with European S & G
 - To create a basis for mutual trust
 - To enhance recognition and mobility
- In practical terms
 - Web-based
 - Easily accessible for students, employers, public, ...
