- Free use of public transport for students in the entire state (Hessen)












History and Campus

- Founded in 1527 as the world's first protestant university,
- Founding place Old University: originates (in its current state) from the nineteenth century,
- Now accommodates the Department of Protestant Theology and our magnificent assembly hall.





- International Master of Science (M.Sc.): Economics of the Middle East (EMEA)






Study & Teaching at University of Marburg

- 26,355 students (2017/2018)
- 3,627 international students (13,8%)
- 132 degree programs:
 - 33 bachelor programs
 - 64 master programs
 - 35 others (state examination, MBA)

Doing a PhD in Marburg

1. Individual doctorate (3-5 years)

- Independent work on written thesis or cumulative
- Supervised by one professor
- In many cases no compulsory attendance, no curriculum
- Requires strong individual diligence & endurance
- Binational PhD as an option

2. Structured programs (3 years)

- E.g. graduate schools, research training groups
- Systematic and intensive supervision
- Structured, pre-defined curriculum, mandatory attendance
- Often international groups of PhD candidates
- Often interdisciplinary approach



Marburg University Research Academy (MARA)

University-wide center for the support of PhD and postdoctoral scholars

Services

- Workshops: Scientific writing, design and management of research projects, funding, time management, career planning, communication and presentation skills etc.
- Advice regarding scholarships, PhD regulations etc.







International Profile
