- Strong research orientation (methodological modules, 6 months devoted to M.Sc. thesis)
- International features (study program and students from two continents, lectures focusing on international agricultural trade and marketing, field research mainly in Latin America)
- Modules on agricultural, environmental and rural development policy (→ focusing on international and national policy)

PROCESS FOR DESIGN OF STUDY PROGRAM AND CREDIT POINTS

- Three-day planning workshop with professors/lecturers from Univ. of Talca and Gö. (in Talca in Aug. 2001):
 - Study program (13 modules), content of modules, number of contact hours, ECTS credit points
- ◆ 1 module is about 56 contact hours with 6 ECTS points
- In total the Master program comprises 120 ECTS points. (M.Sc. Thesis: 24 ECTS, colloquium: 6 ECTS)
- Joint preparation of an English study guide by University of Talca and Göttingen (Fall 2001)

PROCESS FOR DESIGN OF STUDY PROGRAM (cont.)

- Meetings among lecturers to discuss study program/guide
- Discussion/approval of M.Sc. program by the faculties at University of Talca and Göttingen
- Change in number of modules to 15 modules in 2002/2003
- Design of a joint M.Sc. transcript (Univ. of Talca and Göttingen)
- Yearly meetings of program speakers (Diaz / Zeller) either in Talca or Göttingen

KEY POINTS FOR SUCCESS

- DAAD provided financing for coordination visits through the University Partnership program (initial workshop, yearly meetings)
- Strong interest of both universities and its leadership in the program, and flexibility by both partners to jointly solve problems
- Conversion of ALL Diploma to B.Sc./M.Sc.
 Programs at the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences in Göttingen (modules, credit point system)
