


EUA has 840 members based in 48 countries (as of 1 Jan 2020)



The University of Auckland has topped a pioneering new ranking that assesses the social and economic impact of universities based on the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



The Times Higher Education University

Impact Rankings is the world's first global attempt to document evidence of universities' impact on society, rather than just research and teaching performance. Metrics include universities' policies on academic freedom, their use of secure employment contracts and their share of senior female academic staff and are based on 11 of the 17 UN SDGs.




The impact of rankings?

- Overreactions in early stages, sobering since
- Focus on challenges in
 - Public information provision
 - Institutional data management
- Diminishing impact of one or another ranking
 - Choose the one that fits your needs?
- Actual impact difficult to discern

Interpretation of university rankings

- 5. Comparisons between universities should be made keeping in mind the differences between universities
- 6. Uncertainty in university rankings should be acknowledged
- 7. An exclusive focus on the ranks of universities in a university ranking should be avoided; the values of the underlying indicators should be taken into account

Use of university rankings

- 8. Dimensions of university performance not covered by university rankings should not be overlooked
- 9. Performance criteria relevant at the university level should not automatically be assumed to have the same relevance at the department of research group level
- 10. University rankings should be handled cautiously, but they should not be dismissed as being completely useless



To conclude

- International dataset for higher education and research still not any closer
- Importance of understanding the limitations of rankings and the logic and underpinning valued and drivers behind them

It is vital that each university has a coherent mission and strategic plan, and stays true to that mission.
