European push to strengthen the competitive position of Europe's higher education sector. By most accounts, this is an exciting development, but it also raises many important questions. Most fundamentally, what do non-European students ? notably those who are coming to Europe for full-degree programmes rather than short-term exchange experiences ? need from their host institutions in order to succeed? Are the institutions receiving these students delivering necessary information and support services in effective and appropriate ways?
