Abstract

A key question is whether or not beneficiaries should pay the entire cost of their higher education. It is clear that the benefits of higher education are broad. They extend to the public domain and are not limited to individual interests. Therefore, the fundamental question is always to what extent and in what form public funds should be used to support higher education.
